Victim Assistance Unit

The Victim Assistance Program is a specialized unit of the Weld County Sheriff's Office together closely working with the Investigations Unit and the Patrol Division. The program responds to victims of crime, family survivors in cases of sudden or violent death, and delivers many of the death notifications in Weld County in cooperation with the Weld County Coroner's Office. Deputies contact the Victim Assistance Unit in many situations when a victim needs caretaking, information, or referrals.

Crisis Intervention

A Victim Advocate is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, to assist victims of crime and their families. Victims of specific crimes have rights to request and utilize these services. If immediate assistance is not needed, Victim Advocates are in the office on regular workdays. The advocates provide short-term crisis intervention to victims. These advocates include full time staff as well as dedicated community volunteers that are trained in addressing the needs of those touched by crime and crisis in our community.

This position requires reliability, integrity, discretion, and commitment. Because we are looking for a select and elite group of volunteers, the following criteria must be met:

- · Be at least 21 years old
- Complete application process, which includes an integrity interview, criminal history investigation, and polygraph examination
- Attend 40 hours of initial training
- Attend one evening meeting the 2nd Wednesday of each month
- Be on call by phone three days per month
- · Have reliable transportation
- · Make a one year commitment
- Be able to cope with emotional and stressful situations
